# Lessons identified notification

## Guidance according to the exercise directive:

1. Employees of Maritime Emergency Reporting and Assessment Centre (MERAC) have good knowledge of the system and react within time limit.
2. MERAC is a section of the Central Command for Maritime Emergencies (CCME) which is oil spill preparedness and response body in Germany.

# Request for assistance



## Guidance according to the exercise directive.

1. MERAC-Employees have good knowledge of the CECIS and acknowledged requests for assistance prompt.
2. Germany answered four of twelve requests. *Should negative reports be sent next time for the eight “not answered requests”?*
3. Use of database (add offer button) in request overview after advice from ERCC → *Will training intensify regarding this option.*
